COMMON NAME – Fox

SCIENTIFIC NAME – *Vulpes vulpes* (Red fox)

DESCRIPTION –

- Rusty red fur with white underbelly with bushy white tipped tail
- Weight – 6 to 15 lbs

RANGE/HABITAT –

- Worldwide; North America, Asia, Europe, and Australia for Red Fox
- Varies. Includes prairies, scrubland, and forest
- Uses many dens connected by tunnels, specifically one large den for child rearing and winter rest as well as smaller dens for emergencies and food storage.

DIET –

- Omnivorous
- Rodents, insects, and birds
- Fruit and berries

FACTS -

- Every fox has their own individually unique voice
- Combines the keen eyesight of a feline with the agility of a canine
- Can reach pursuit speeds of up to 45 mph
- During colder months, foxes grow more fur to keep warm

COMMON NAME – Gray Fox

SCIENTIFIC NAME – *Urocyon cinereoargenteus*

DESCRIPTION –

- Length – 32-45 inches
- Weight – 7-11 lbs
- Grizzled gray fur with white throat and rusty red sides
- Tail has black mane along top with black tip
- Elongated muzzle and forward pointing ears

RANGE/HABITAT –

- Southern Canada to Venezuela
- Chaparral, wooded areas, bouldered areas in canyons and desert areas
- Lives in den dug into soil as long as 75 feet with 10+ exits

DIET –

- Omnivore
- Small mammals
- Eggs, insects, birds, fruits, acorns, berries

FACTS -

- Climbs up and down trees with relative ease, being the only member of the dog family able to do so
- Can run at speeds of up to 28 mph for short distances
- Can live up to 10 years in captivity
